Jesus was raised from the dead so we might receive Him, believe Him and have life in His name.

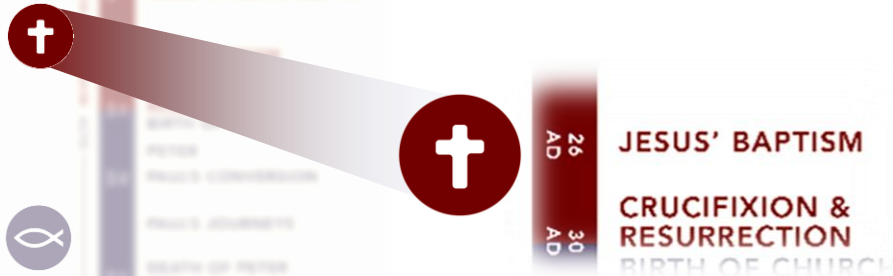
