The main idea of John 19:17-30:

Jesus, the King of the Jews, finished the work of salvation on the cross.

The following questions can be used during a family worship time. Take time as a family this week to talk about the Story and what you are learning as you read. The hymns on the next pages are from our worship service. Sing them together as a family during your family worship time this week.

Discussion questions:

Why did Jesus die for our sins?

How did Jesus' followers respond to the tragic events surrounding His crucifixion?

What can we do on a daily basis to walk in an intimate and living friendship with God?



Peter, one of Jesus' closest friends, vigorously denied three times that he even knew the Lord. How must this have felt to Jesus? What are ways we deny Jesus and act like we don't know Him?
