


The Kingdoms' Fall



The main idea of Ezekiel 37:1-14

God will raise His people from the dead and put His Spirit within them.

The following questions can be used during a family worship time. Take time as a family this week to talk about the Story and what you are learning as you read. The hymns on the next pages are from our worship service. Sing them together as a family during your family worship time this week.



Discussion questions:

How should we pray for people (even those who do mean things)?

Why did disaster come upon God's people?

What negative effects of sin have you seen in your life?

In one of the most hopeless times in biblical history, the prophet Ezekiel pointed ahead to a future time when the story's ending will be rewritten. How do Ezekiel's words bring hope when it feels as if the story is over?

As a family:

Hezekiah had children who were not faithful and so did Josiah. Wee see this pattern throughout the Bible with some very godly leaders. Identify some family members who have wandered from God. Pray for them. As applicable, consider giving them a call, sending a note of encouragement, or spending time with them. Ask God to use you to extend His message of grace.
